Post Scrutineer's Comments.

Our auditor, John Hyatt, has suggested that we treat the £7,500 loan to Five Towns as an asset and record it alongside our and bank balances cash balances – our end of year balance would then rise to £58,183.60. This is a reasonable accounting treatment. We took a decision at the BoT to treat it as an expenditure as the loan isn't secured against any assets. In light of the comments we will review at the next BoT meeting.

- District Finances remain in a healthy position with funds of £50,638.60.
- A deficit for the year was recorded of £2,502.26. This figure is skewed as it includes the loan of £7,500 made to Five Towns theatre from the 'restricted' Burdi Boys fund. Otherwise surplus would have been c£5k.
- Burdi Boys was held in November 2023 and again generated a surplus. This is expected to be c£1,500 once all costs have been received. A number of costs i.e. PRS, equipment storage, theatre deposits occur in earlier or later financial years than the show.
- Another successful District Camp was held. The District aims to hold these as non-surplus events.

A note on the scrutiny process

The accounts are checked by an independent scrutineer (auditor).

In addition to this the accounts receive regular review. The accounts are presented at each Board of Trustees meeting – every 2 months – and someone verifies the bank balance at each meeting i.e. we login at the meeting and check the money agrees with the accounts. For each large event i.e. Burdi and District we present the accounts and scrutinise at the meeting. So there are a number of levels of review.


